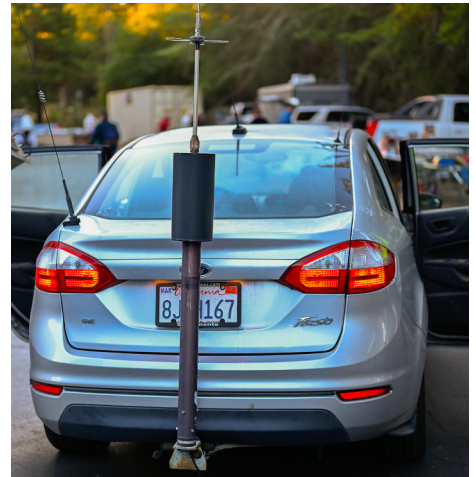

Visit to K3LR in Western Pennsylvania

This year I had the fortune of traveling to Dayton for Hamvention. Right before the trip I approached Tim Duffy, the owner of K3LR, for a possible visit to his fabulous contesting stations. Tim graciously said yes and I was set to visit right after Hamvention was over.

When I arrived at K3LR, Tim had already prepared a visit not just for me, but for a handful of very seasoned testers, some of them who I knew by many QSOs. Tim proceeded to give us the tour of his antenna farm. Given the background of the audience, he went deep into the details on all technical aspects of his station.



Of course, mono-band towers with several antennas for transmission and lots of receive antennas scattered throughout the property to ensure the station can hear those tiny signals from far away.



Tim is a very thorough technical person (besides an accomplished operator). All the cabling from the base of the towers back to the shack are done in a clean and effective way. Station

reliability is a number one goal. Lots of things to maintain here.



Lots of aluminum in those towers. Trees were pruned away from the property to protect guy wires.



Back at the shack, twelve operating positions are available with all Icom top-of-the line transceivers. All equipment: Transceivers, amplifiers, rotators, etc. are the same brand and model to ease maintenance. 6 Bands can be manned at the same time in a multi-multi configuration with a pilot operator running the band and secondary operator fishing for valuable multipliers.



All amplifiers are tube based as he claims solid state ones are not clean enough.

No remoting in the station. His philosophy is: everybody hands on at the station while building camaraderie and having fun together.

Many great operators have operated from K3LR over the years. Tim's current focus is on new young testers. He is doing a great job attracting them and keeping them on the chair. The proof is in the pudding and most come back for more.

On my way out, I was gifted a K3LR mug as a souvenir of my visit.



However, that wasn't enough for Tim. A few weeks later when I was back home a package arrived with a personalized K3LR: K6KM Roberto mug. Hint? Mmmhhhh

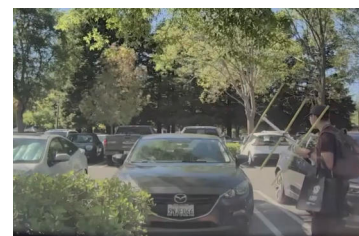

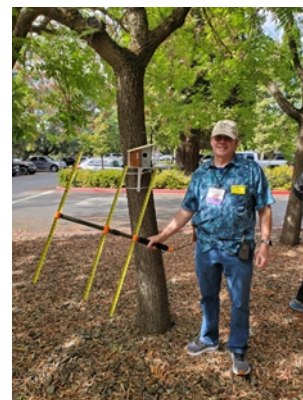

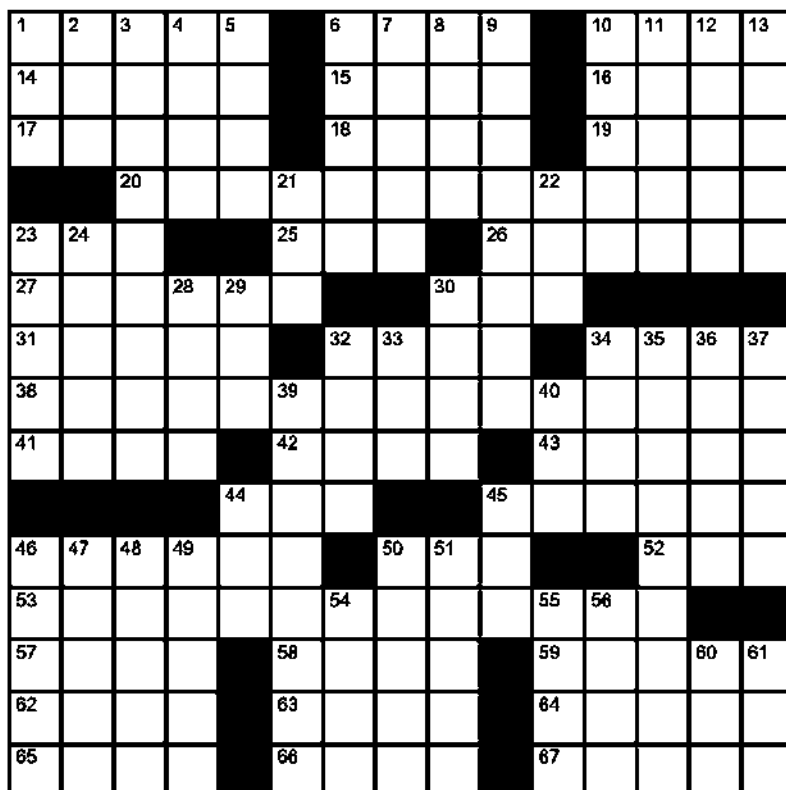

ARRL HOA Support

Member Bulletin announcing that ARRL needs your help with generating support in Congress for the passage of the Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act.

Whether you live in a neighborhood or subdivision with antenna restrictions or not, we need ALL licensed Amateur Radio operators to support this legislation.

ARRL has designed an easy campaign. Go to <https://send-a-letter.org/hoa/> insert your Amateur Radio callsign, check to make sure your name and address are correct, then click the big red button that says, "**Send My Letters**". It's that simple. Your letters will be hand delivered to your Representative and Senators by our Washington legislative team.

Because of work, school or other family needs, many Hams are forced to live in communities with private land restrictions that prohibit the installation of Amateur Radio antennas outside their residence.

Many may not have the choice to choose to live in an area without such restrictions. Over time, severe constraints imposed by recorded private land use restrictions have been overturned by Federal law, such as the prohibitions against satellite TV dishes, TV antennas, wireless internet antennas, and even flag poles.

However, Amateur Radio operators are still denied the right to put up antennas, even simple ones. While you may live now in an area without such restrictions, the time may come when you might have to move to one with these constraints. That's why we need EVERYONE to support this campaign.

If not for you, then for your current and future fellow Amateur Radio operators, please support this bill. It will be a first step to protecting the future of Amateur Radio.
