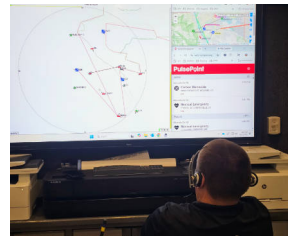

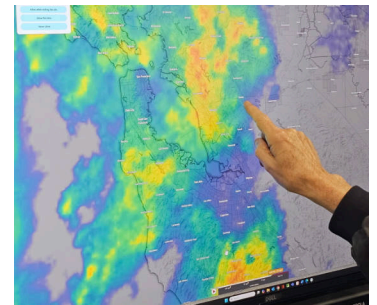

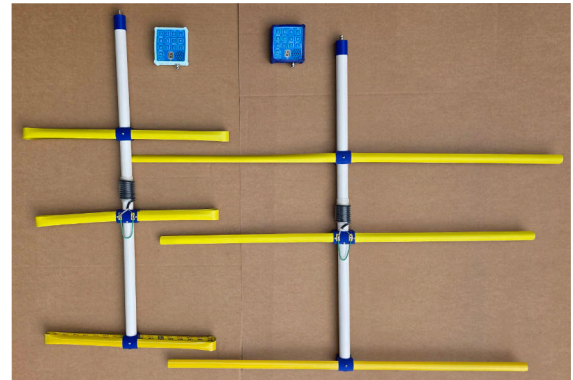

After deploying two hidden transmitters, Brian and Nate took some time to teach the scouts the basics. They covered the core concepts behind RDF, discussed its practical importance for community service and scouting, and showed the kids how turning it into a game makes it incredibly fun.

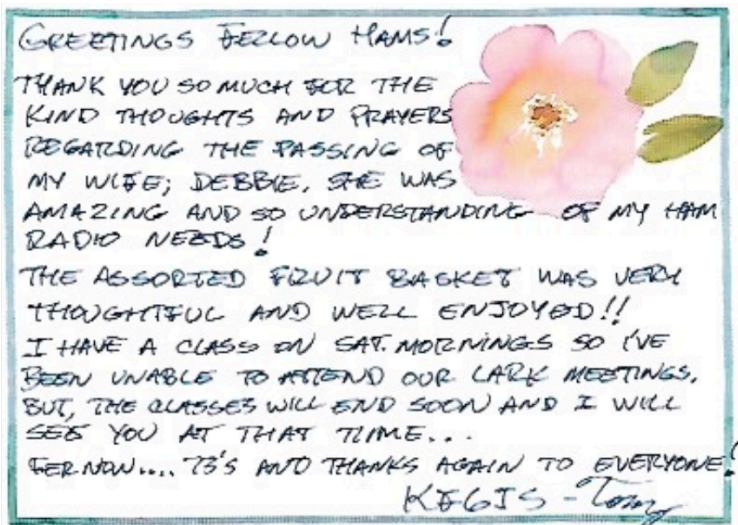
